Wyman Duggan is part of an "all-star" lobbyist team hired by a foreign company to try to buy our JEA. This could mean higher prices and bad customer service for Jacksonville Families.¹

EXTEND TERM LIMITS SO POLITICIANS CAN STAY IN OFFICE LONGER

As Vice Chairman of the Task Force on Consolidated Government, Duggan wanted to extend the term limits of professional politicians. Giving them more time to have tax payer funded health care and pension plans.²

WANTS TO TAKE AWAY YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE FOR SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

As Chairman of the Charter Revision Commission of the City of Jacksonville, Wyman Duggan advocated that School Board members be appointed by political insiders and not elected by the parents of the children that they are sworn to serve.³

Duggan Wants to Double Dip at the Taxpayer Expense

If elected to the State Legislature, Wyman Duggan will collect an annual taxpayer paid salary of \$29,697 and be eligible for taxpayer subsidized health care and pension plans. Meanwhile, Wyman Duggan can keep his lucrative job as a paid Lobbyist to the Jacksonville City Council.
